Tariffs are taxes. They are paid for by Wisconsin families, farmers, businesses, workers, and communities.



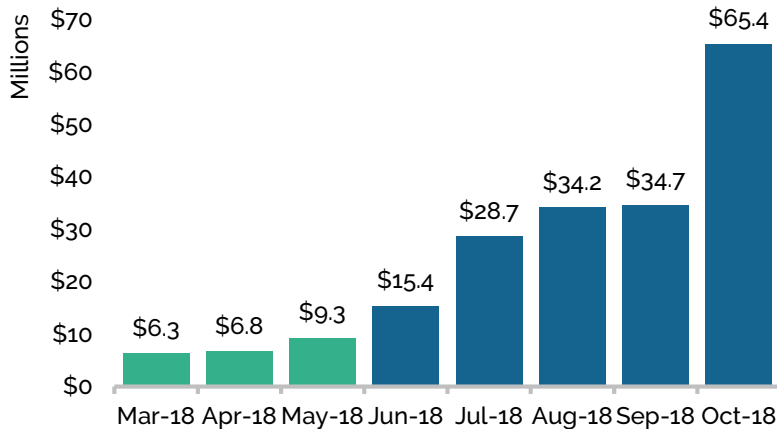

THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING WISCONSIN ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Wisconsin businesses paid \$65 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in October. That is over 10 times the tariffs paid on those same products in October 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Wisconsin businesses have paid an extra \$139 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Wisconsin exports have faced \$71 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$19 million in October. These tariffs make Wisconsin less competitive. In October, Wisconsin exports subject to retaliation dropped by 30%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Wisconsin jobs are on the line.
