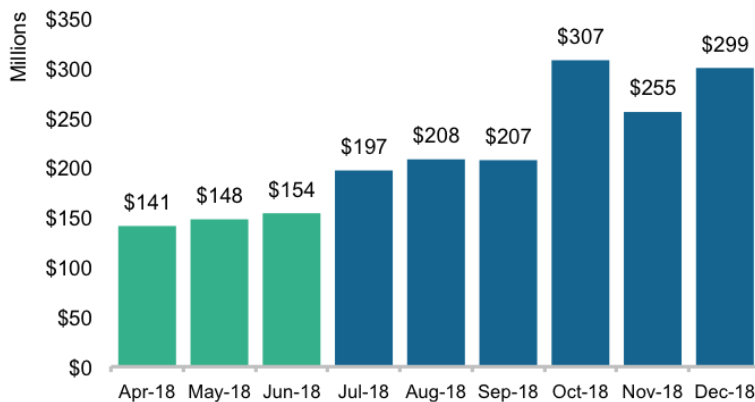

THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING GEORGIA ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Georgia businesses paid \$182 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in December. That is about 8 times the tariffs paid on those same products in December 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Georgia businesses have paid an extra \$578 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Georgia exports have faced \$114 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$20 million in December. These tariffs make Georgia less competitive. In December, Georgia exports subject to retaliation dropped by 37%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Georgia jobs are on the line.
