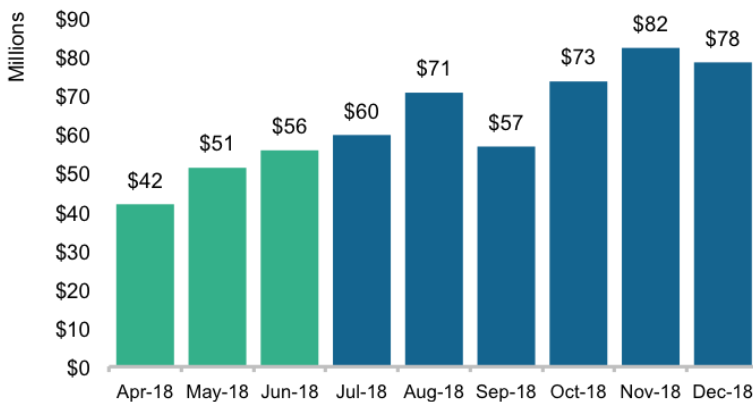

### **THE LATEST NUMBERS:** NEW TARIFFS HITTING MARYLAND ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Maryland businesses paid \$34 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in December. That is about 7 times the tariffs paid on those same products in December 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Maryland businesses have paid an extra \$145 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Maryland exports have faced \$28 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$5.2 million in December. These tariffs make Maryland less competitive. In December, Maryland exports subject to retaliation dropped by 40%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Maryland jobs are on the line.
