Tariffs are taxes. They are paid for by Mississippi families, farmers, businesses, workers, and communities.

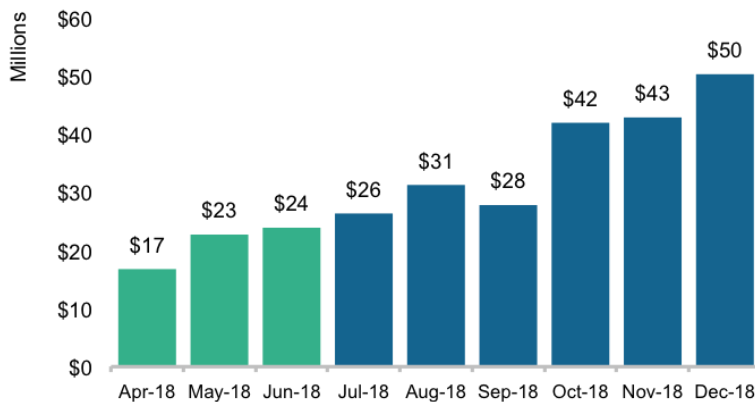


## TRADE SUPPORTS 298,200 JOBS ACROSS MISSISSIPPI

### THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING MISSISSIPPI ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Mississippi businesses paid \$31 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in December. That is about 10 times the tariffs paid on those same products in December 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Mississippi businesses have paid an extra \$93 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Mississippi exports have faced \$45 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$12 million in December. These tariffs make Mississippi less competitive. In December, Mississippi exports subject to retaliation dropped by 38%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Mississippi jobs are on the line.
