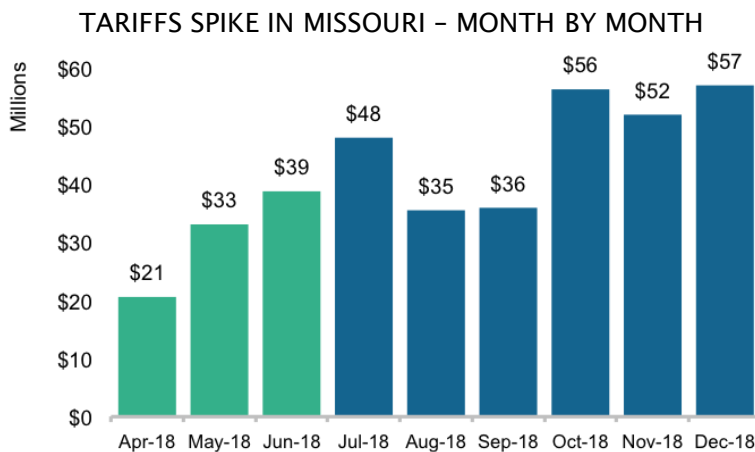

THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING MISSOURI ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Missouri businesses paid \$40 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in December. That is about 8 times the tariffs paid on those same products in December 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Missouri businesses have paid an extra \$157 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Missouri exports have faced \$73 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$12 million in December. These tariffs make Missouri less competitive. In December, Missouri exports subject to retaliation dropped by 63%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Missouri jobs are on the line.
