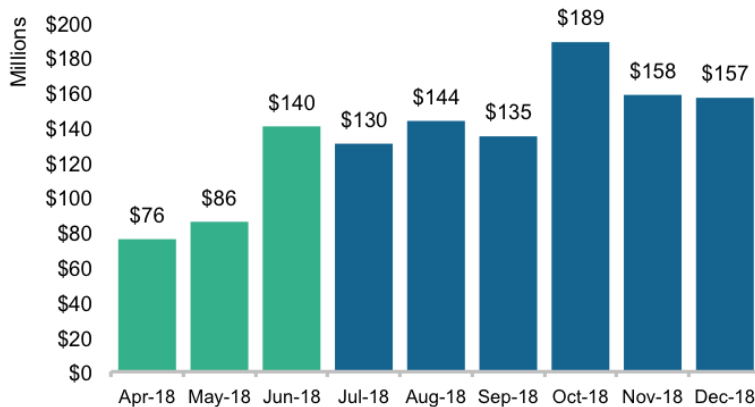

THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING PENNSYLVANIA ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, Pennsylvania businesses paid \$91 million in tariffs on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs in December. That is about 10 times the tariffs paid on those same products in December 2017.
- Since new tariffs were imposed, Pennsylvania businesses have paid an extra \$425 million in import tariffs.
- Since the trade war began, Pennsylvania exports have faced \$185 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$34 million in December. These tariffs make Pennsylvania less competitive. In December, Pennsylvania exports subject to retaliation dropped by 17%.

President Trump should successfully negotiate with our trading partners and end these costly and harmful tariffs. Pennsylvania jobs are on the line.
