

THE LATEST NUMBERS: <u>NEW TARIFFS HITTING MISSOURI ECONOMY HARD</u>

- According to the most recent data, Missouri businesses have paid an extra \$454 million in import taxes on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs, including \$42 million in September.
- Tariffs on China "List 3" goods accounted for \$243 million of the new taxes paid to date. Missouri imported \$2.1 billion of "List 4" products in 2018, of which \$976 million started facing additional tariffs of 15% on September 1, and the rest will face additional 15% tariffs starting December 15.
- Since the trade war began, Missouri exports have faced \$260 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$17 million in September. These tariffs make Missouri exports less competitive.
